#### Objectives:

Discuss methods to optimize visualization in the setting of active bleeding and clots.

2. Review various difficult positions and anatomical "pain points" of upper GI hemostasis and how to manage them.

 Identify options for rescue hemostasis including topical agents, over-the-scope clips, and fully covered esophageal stents for refractory isophageal variceal hemorrhage.

Dr. Matt Bechtold is the current Vice-President of the Missouri GI Society. He is a general gastroenterologist and nutrition specialist at the Harry S. Truman Veterans Hospital (HSTVA) and University of Missouri. He serves as the Section Chief of Gastroenterology at HSTVA.


A life-long Missourian, Matt was born in the small town of Boonville, MO. After graduating from Boonville High School, he attended Southeast Missouri State University in Cape Girardeau, MO. Working his way through school as a restaurant delivery driver, he graduated with honors from SEMO with a degree in zoology. Subsequently, he attended graduate school for one year at SEMO, specializing in molecular biology. He then moved to Columbia, MO to attend medical school at the University of Missouri, where he was first introduced to the great field of gastroenterology. Once completed, he elected to stay and complete his internal medicine residency at Mizzou. Upon completion, Matt served in the hybrid role of Chief Resident of Internal Medicine and cardiac service hospitalist for one year. Given his interest in GI, he continued his education in a gastroenterology fellowship at Mizzou.

His passion for teaching and research led him to stay in academics at Mizzou. During his 15-year career at the University of Missouri Division of Gastroenterology, Matt experienced accelerated promotion to Professor of Clinical Medicine, becoming one of the fastest in the system to achieve this honor. He also completed a nutrition fellowship. In 2023, Matt became full-time at the HSTVA while staying as an Adjunct Professor of Clinical Medicine at Mizzou.

Over his career, Matt has published nearly 400 manuscripts, book chapters, and abstracts. He has given many annual lectures at the Mizzou Medical School and numerous national talks. He serves in multiple national GI societies where he has received the prestigious honor of Fellowship in all major American GI and nutrition societies (AGAF, FASGE, FACG, FASPEN). He served as Chair of multiple national committees, including ASPEN's Enteral Nutrition Committee, ASPEN's Conference Planning Committee, and ASGE's Abstract Review Committee for quality improvement.

Matt does enjoy life outside of work as well. With his wife, Lisa, and his two children, Alexandria and Zachary, he enjoys traveling and going to children's events, such as his daughter's horse-riding competitions or son's golfing events. He also likes to stay busy with sports, where he has won multiple tournaments and championships throughout his life in golf, baseball, basketball, soccer, and softball. Being a dedicated Missourian, he has a vision to help improve the lives of all gastroenterologists around the state. This is why he is proud to serve in the Missouri GI Society.
